Except where varied below, this competition will be judged in accordance with the current Pony Club Dressage Rulebook.

PLEASE NOTE:

ALL Preliminary Rounds will be run in accordance with the 2009 Pony Club Dressage Rule book and Dengie Dressage Rules 2009/2010.

Area Competitions and The Championships will be run in accordance with the 2010 Pony Club Dressage Rule book and Dengie Dressage Rules 2009/2010.

Every eventuality cannot be provided for in these rules. In any unforeseen or exceptional circumstances it is the duty of the relevant officials to make a decision in a sporting spirit and to approach as nearly as possible the intention of these Rules.

RULES FOR **NOVICE WINTER LEAGUE DRESSAGE**

ELIGIBILITY

Open to individual Pony Club Members, but excluding any combination of horse/pony and rider that have represented their Branch at Open Area qualifiers for The Pony Club Dressage Championships or any Rider who has competed at The Pony Club Open Dressage Championships. (This does not include any other classes held in conjunction with Area Qualifiers).

Riders must not have won any BD (or DI) points or competed at BD (or DI) Elementary level or above.

Centre Members are invited to compete in this competition.

Horses may be graded British Dressage Novice or below.

TESTS

The Pony Club Novice Dressage Test 2009 shall be used at the **Preliminary Rounds**.

The Pony Club Novice Dressage Championships Test 2005 shall be used at **Area Competitions and the Championships**.

Please also to refer to General Rules applicable to all Levels.

RULES FOR OPEN WINTER LEAGUE DRESSAGE

ELIGIBILITY

Open to all Members of The Pony Club, including Associates. Centre Members are invited to compete in this competition.

Horses which have competed at Advanced Medium level or above during the current year are not eligible. This includes Hors Concours entries.

TESTS

The Pony Club Intermediate Dressage Test 2009 shall be used at the **Preliminary Rounds**.

The Pony Club Open Dressage Test 2008 shall be used at **Area Competitions and the Championships**.

Please also to refer to General Rules applicable to all Levels.

GENERAL RULES APPLICABLE TO ALL LEVELS

Horses and/or riders who qualify for both the Novice and Open Winter League Championships in the same year must nominate which class they wish to compete in on the day they qualify so that the qualification can be passed down the line.

PASSING DOWN THE LINE - In the event of a competitor being placed in a qualifying position at a Preliminary Round when they have already qualified for the Area Competition, the place may pass down the line. If a competitor who qualifies for the Championships at their Area competition subsequently discovers that they are unable to compete at the Championships, then the qualification will pass down the line.

MULTIPLE HORSES – In the event of a rider qualifying more than one horse for the Championships, they may only take one horse to the Championships and must nominate which one they will take at the Area Competition. The other qualifying place will be passed down the line.

SUBSTITUTIONS – Substitutions of horse/pony or rider will not be accepted at Area Competitions or at the Championships.

SADDLERY AND DRESS - The Pony Club saddlery and dress rules apply at the Area competitions and at the Championships. Preliminary Rounds may be run under British Dressage Rules or 2009 Pony Club Rules.

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

AREA QUALIFIERS

Preliminary Rounds run from 1st October 2009 until 28th February 2010. *All classes must be registered with The Pony Club Office by the Show Organiser at least 4 weeks in advance of the competition.*

Please note non-Members of The Pony Club are allowed to compete in any Preliminary Round but must become fully paid up Members to compete at their Area Competition.

The first 4 at each Preliminary Round and any tying for these places will qualify for one of 19 Area Competitions. See also rule for 'passing down the line'.

A Member may compete at Preliminary Rounds in any Area, but they **must** go to their own Area Competition.

CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFIERS

The Area Competitions shall be held in March. If there are more than 30 competitors in the Area competitions the class will be divided into sections, with one judge for each section.

Qualification at Area Competitions will work on a ratio basis:

Number of Competitors	Number to Qualify
1 – 10	1
11 – 20	2
21 – 30	3
31 – 40	4
41 – 50	5
And pro rata.	

These competitors will qualify for The Pony Club Dengie Winter League Dressage Championships at Warwickshire College on Sunday 28th March 2010.

THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

If numbers permit, there will be more than one section/arena at the Championships. In this case there will be a ride off. The first 2 competitors in each section will qualify for the ride off.

JUDGES

The Show Organiser shall appoint Judges (one per Arena) from the British Dressage Judges Panel Lists 1 - 6 for the Preliminary rounds and Area Competitions. Championship Judges shall be appointed by The Pony Club Office who must be on Lists 1 – 4.

ENTRIES & ENTRY FEES

Preliminary Rounds – Maximum entry fee: £12

Please contact the relevant Show Secretary for details.

Area Competitions – Entry fee: £12

Entries for competitors who have qualified for the Area Competitions should be sent on the Entry Form provided, together with the Entry Fee to the Secretary of the Area Competition at least 7 days before the date of the competition. Organisers may use their discretion in accepting a late entry.

Championships – Entry fee: £14

Entries for competitors who have qualified for the Championships, should be sent/faxed on the Entry Form provided, together with the Entry Fee to The Pony Club, Stoneleigh Park, Kenilworth, Warwickshire CV8 2RW by **22nd March 2010**.
